1. What Is a Passkey?

A passkey lets you sign in using:

- Your **fingerprint**
- Your **face**
- Or your **device PIN**

No passwords to remember.

No typing.

Very secure.

2. Why Passkeys Are Safer

Passkeys:

- Cannot be guessed
- Cannot be stolen by scammers
- Stay safely on your device

You are the key.

3. How to Use a Passkey

When a website says:

“Use a Passkey?”

Tap **Continue**.

Confirm with fingerprint, face, or PIN.

Next time you sign in:

Just unlock your device.

4. What You Need

To use passkeys, you need:

- A smartphone, tablet, or computer
 - Fingerprint, face ID, or a PIN
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5. What Is MFA?

Multi-Factor Authentication adds a second step:

- A text message code
- A pop-up asking “Is this you?”

It protects your accounts.

6. Why MFA Helps

Even if someone knows your password,
they still cannot get in.

7. Passkeys vs MFA

Passkeys are:

- As secure as MFA
 - Often more secure
 - Easier to use
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8. Staying Safe Online

Simple tips:

- Never share your PIN
 - Avoid unknown links
 - Keep devices updated
 - Use passkeys when offered
