Slide 2 - What Is a Passkey?

A passkey lets you sign in using:

- Your **fingerprint**
- Your **face**
- Or your **device PIN**

No passwords to remember.

Slide 3 - Why Passkeys Are Better

Passkeys are:

- **Simple** - no typing
 - **Fast** - unlock and go
 - **Secure** - cannot be stolen by scammers
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Slide 4 - How Passkeys Work

You unlock your device.

Your device logs you in.

That's it.

Slide 5 - Where You Can Use Passkeys

Many services now support passkeys:

- Google
 - Apple
 - Microsoft
 - Banks
 - Shopping sites
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Slide 6 - What You Need

To use passkeys, you need:

- A smartphone, tablet, or computer
 - Fingerprint, face ID, or a PIN
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Slide 7 - Setting Up a Passkey

When a website says:

“Use a Passkey?”

Choose **Continue**.

Confirm with fingerprint, face, or PIN.

Slide 8 - Next Time You Sign In

Just unlock your device.

No password needed.

Slide 9 - What Is MFA?

Multi-Factor Authentication adds a second step:

- A text message code
 - A pop-up asking "Is this you?"
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Slide 10 - Why MFA Helps

Even if someone knows your password,
they still cannot get in.

Slide 11 - Passkeys vs MFA

Passkeys are:

- As secure as MFA
 - Often **more** secure
 - Easier to use
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Slide 12 - Staying Safe Online

Simple safety tips:

- Never share your PIN
- Avoid clicking unknown links
- Keep devices updated
- Use passkeys when offered

Slide 13 - You Are the Key

Your fingerprint, face, or PIN

keeps your accounts safe.
